Prayer & Praise

Continue to pray for **Leo Stuart**. Here is an update from Julie. "Leo is doing generally well. He's walking mostly unassisted, except he still uses walking poles at school. He still struggles with nausea. He really wants to get off of the feeding tube, but isn't that motivated to eat, as everything tastes different than it used to."

Praise that **Julie Stuart's dad, Adolf Kungel** is showing some signs of recovery after a major stroke this past week. "After a couple of days of being very sleepy and minimally responsive, Dad significantly improved today, which wasn't what anyone was expecting. He is more wakeful, interactive and understands everything. We now wait and see how much function he can regain with time and rehabilitation. Thanks for the love and prayers."

Pray for **Arelene Ungaro's husband Bill** who is thankfully having moments of alertness, though he is generally experiencing declining health with his medical team reporting that "Bill is at the end of his dementia". This week he saw the surgeon who did his cancer surgery on his face to assess an infection and a new lump on his throat. "I pray that the lump in his throat isn't cancer". Caregiving is hard. Praise that **Arelene's sister Marie** has been with Arelene and Bill these past couple of weeks "which has been a great support and comfort for me."

Pray for **Mandy Cheung's mom, Virginia** as she now has a surgery date to remove her cancerous kidney on November 21st. Mandy asks for prayer that the cancer has not spread. Pray for comfort as Virginia sits in this time of waiting.

Praise that **Joe Kerkoff** is now home from hospital where he continues to recover from pneumonia, general confusion and weakness. Pray for **his wife Hilda**, **his daughter Leona and Rob**, and the rest of the family as they support and care for Joe. Pray that his medical team will address all of his needs during this time of recovery.

Pray for **Trudi Alves' daughter Terri and son-in-law Rick** who has been diagnosed with stage 4 oral cancer. "Rick is awaiting surgery to remove his tongue, voice box & lymph nodes. He will have a permanent trach tube inserted and will be in hospital for 2-3 weeks. At this point I will need whatever God supplies me with to be able to support Terri. God will never leave me, nor forsake me. I really need to hold onto that when reality replaces sensibility". Pray for comfort and peace for Rick as he comes to accept this treatment plan.

Pray for **Joan Kyer** as she continues to recover in hospital. Praise that there is a lot of movement toward her discharge so she can continue her rehabilitation at home!

Pray for **Joy Pruden** as she searches for a job. May she have perseverance, hope, and find a position which fits her skills well.

Praise God for a miracle! **Ashley Ireland's mom, Michelle**, continues to show signs of recovery. "I'm just praying for her to have a good recovery. I'm praying that she will be OK with the deficits that are left and that she won't get depressed. I've been praying for her hearing to come back or for her to have the ability to get a cochlear implant so she can hear again. It's honestly amazing what a few weeks can do because she's already doing so much better than last week and I just keep praying that continues."

Pray for **Stephanie Munn's mom** whose brain tumour has returned. "Despite surgery and very intensive chemotherapy and radiation, the prognosis is not very positive, so she has opted to no longer continue with treatment and has put it all in God's hands. She remains a very devout believer and wants to just enjoy her days now. Our family is obviously very affected and saddened by this, but we trust in the Lord and we are asking for prayers to keep her happy and comfortable until she joins our father in heaven."

Pray for **Cindy Favell** as she awaits results from an ultrasound and an appointment with an ENT to deal with her ongoing infection. Cindy says she does feel some relief because she is not coughing as much lately - praise for that!

Pray for **Isla Chambers' husband Lance** who is now 10 weeks post surgery. "His broken hip is healing well and the physio treatments can now work towards weaning him from crutches and cane. There is still work to be done to restore the affected muscle tissue but overall it was a good report. Many thanks for everyone's prayers!"
